# **Course Description:**

This course is designed to introduce students to web design using HTML5 and CSS3. Concepts discussed include understanding HTML/HTML5, responsive web design, how to structure web pages using both HTML and CSS, how to use elements such as tables and forms, and how to add multimedia to create dynamic and engaging web pages.

# **Course Competencies:**

Upon completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- 1. Use a text editor to create simple web pages.
- 2. Use a text editor to create Cascading File Sheet (CSS) files.
- 3. Design and create appropriate layouts for web pages using wire frames.
- 4. Design and create appropriate layouts for web pages using the CSS box method.
- 5. Understand the steps necessary to upload and maintain web sites.
- 6. Discuss how languages such as JavaScript and jQuery enhance web pages.
- 7. Discuss third-party development tools, and how to use them.
