FOOD SERVICE POLICY
REGARDING SERVICE TO THE PUBLIC

In the best interests of the college and private businesses, the HCC Board of Trustees has established this policy regarding public use of the college food service.

The Board recognizes that the primary purpose of the food service is to serve college students and secondarily to serve employees, guests, and those people or groups who are involved in some aspect of college activities. In fact, the college food service is truly a “cafeteria style” operation that is totally different from any privately owned businesses in Doniphan County. In that sense, the food service is not designed to compete with private operations.

However, it is likely that individual members of the public and public groups will occasionally want to use the food services and facilities at the college. The Board does not wish to prohibit public use of “public” facilities; however, the policy of the board is to prohibit the college and the food service company from advertising and marketing food services to the general public. Individual members of the public will not be turned away. Community groups and organizations will be accommodated (if possible) on an occasional basis, but will not be allowed to hold regularly scheduled weekly meetings involving college food services.

The Board of Trustees reserves the right to modify this policy should experience with the food service operation or circumstances change.
